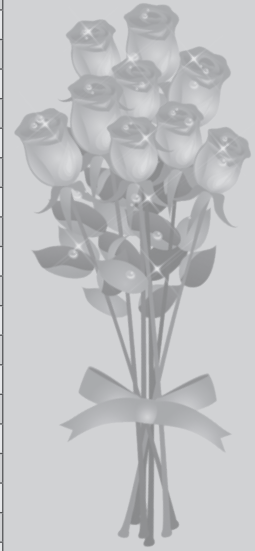

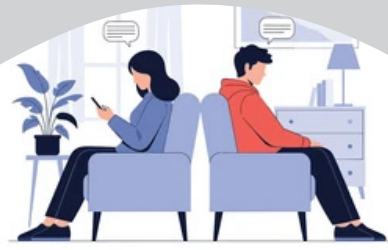

So, my dear friend...

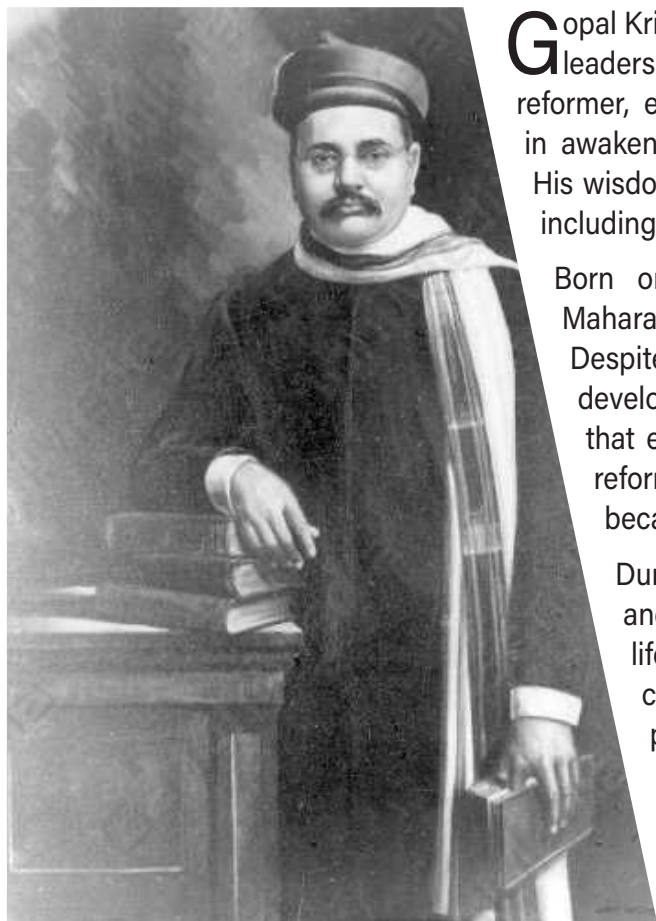
- Free your heart from bitterness,

GOPAL KRISHNA GOKHALE – A Guiding Star of India's Freedom Movement



Gopal Krishna Gokhale was one of the earliest and most respected leaders of India's freedom movement. A statesman, social reformer, educationist, and patriot, Gokhale played a crucial role in awakening political consciousness in India during British rule. His wisdom, dedication, and sacrifices inspired future generations, including Mahatma Gandhi, who regarded him as his political guru.

Born on 9 May 1866 in Ratnagiri district of present-day Maharashtra, Gokhale came from a modest family background. Despite financial difficulties, he excelled in education and developed a deep interest in public affairs. He strongly believed that education was essential for national progress and social reform. He later joined the Deccan Education Society and became a professor at Fergusson College in Pune.

During British rule, Indians faced poverty, discrimination, and the denial of political rights. Gokhale entered public life with the determination to fight these injustices through constitutional and peaceful methods. He became a prominent leader of the Indian National Congress and belonged to the moderate school of thought. He believed in dialogue, reform, and democratic methods rather than violence.

As a member of the Imperial Legislative Council, Gokhale fearlessly criticised unjust British policies. He demanded a reduction of taxes, improvement in education, and greater Indian participation in administration. His speeches were admired for their clarity, patriotism, and deep concern for the welfare of ordinary people.

Gokhale also worked tirelessly for social reform. He opposed caste discrimination and promoted education among the poor and weaker sections of society. In 1905, he founded the Servants of India Society to train dedicated individuals for national service. The Society encouraged young people to work selflessly for the upliftment of the nation.

One of Gokhale's greatest contributions was his influence on Mahatma Gandhi. Gandhi admired Gokhale's simplicity, honesty, moderation, and spirit of public service. Gokhale guided Gandhi in understanding India's political and social conditions and helped shape his early political thinking.

Despite poor health and enormous pressures, Gokhale continued serving the nation tirelessly. He passed away on 19 February 1915 at the age of forty-eight. Though his life was short, his contribution to India's freedom movement was immense.

Gopal Krishna Gokhale remains a shining example of integrity, patriotism, and selfless service. His life teaches us that true leadership is based on wisdom, sacrifice, compassion, and dedication to the welfare of society. He was indeed a guiding star who illuminated the path for India's struggle for freedom and inspired generations to work for the nation with honesty and courage. Jai Hind
